

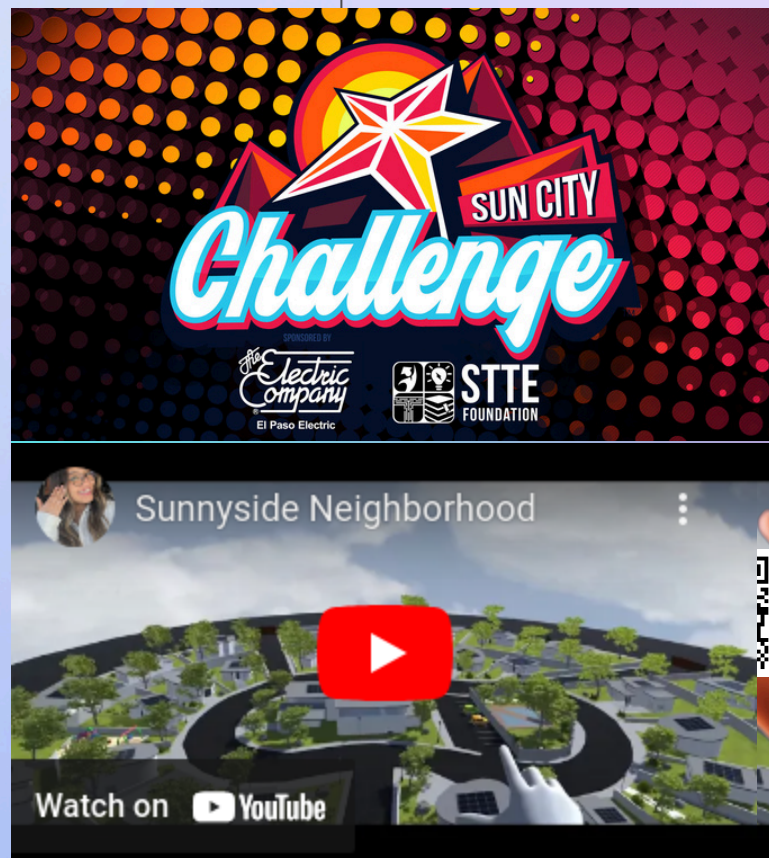
2019: Reinforcing Foundation: Expanding Impact

Q1

Sun City Challenge VR

The Sun City Challenge is a real-world high school technical competition to re-engineer, 3D design, and educate the community on the power of renewable energy. Students accelerated acquiring technical skills for a 21st-century workforce by creatively proposing renewable energy solutions from three main categories; Smart Sustainable Neighborhood, Historic Landmark or Building, and Solar Star Mountain and Education Tourist Center.

The program impacted 52 high school students from 15 high schools. \$15K in technology equipment was awarded to schools, along with \$10K in cash prizes.

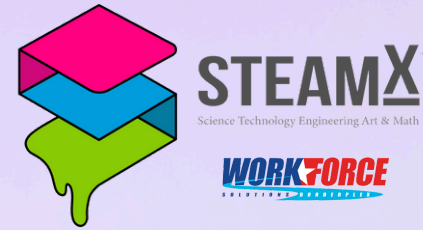
Summer Camps

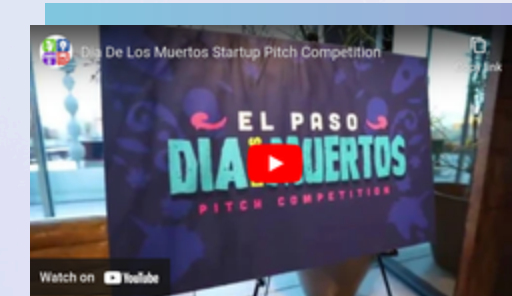
